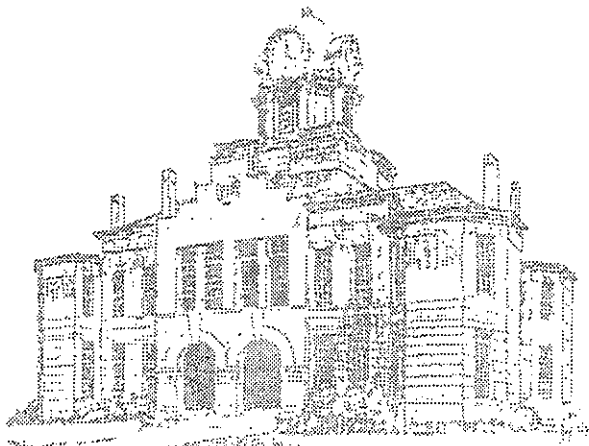

# CUMBERLAND COUNTY COMMISSION MONTHLY MEETING MINUTES

MARCH 19, 2018

Be it remembered that the Cumberland County Commission met in monthly session on Monday, March 19, 2018 at the courthouse in Crossville, Tennessee. Sheriff Casey Cox called the meeting to order at 6:00 o'clock P.M. Present and presiding was Chairman Pro Tem, Commissioner Allen Foster who explained that Commission Chairman Mayor Kenneth Carey, Jr. was absent from tonight's meeting while attending a Upper Cumberland Human Resource Agency (UCHRA) legislative trip to Washington D.C. Minister Clyde Webb from the Cumberland Worship Center was invited by Commissioner Foster to give the Invocation and he asked Members of the Young Marines to lead the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag of the United States of America. Also present at the meeting were County Clerk Jule Bryson, County Attorney Randal Boston and the following County Commissioners:

A quorum being present, the Cumberland County Commission was opened in due form of law and the following proceedings were had to wit:

1. MINUTES OF FEBRUARY 20, 2018 MONTHLY CUMBERLAND COUNTY COMMISSION MEETING:

On motion of Commissioner Claflin, second by Commissioner Stone, moved the minutes of the February 20, 2018 Monthly Commission Meeting be approved, treat same as read, made a matter of record, and filed.

The motion to approve the February 2018 Meeting Minutes carried by a roll vote of 16 ayes from the Commission present with Commissioner Gibson abstaining from the vote.

2. UNFINISHED BUSINESS: RESOLUTION 01-2018-5-TO APPOINT JENNIFER PHILLIPS, RON ERICK, GREG WATSON AND JOHN KIRBY AS JUDICIAL COMMISSIONERS FOR CUMBERLAND COUNTY FOR TERMS NOT TO EXCEED ONE (1) YEAR COMMENCING JANUARY 16, 2018:

A discussion was initiated by Commissioner Claflin when he asked the County Attorney if the resolution should appoint the Judicial Commissioner's to four (4) year terms instead of one (1) year terms in order to be in compliance with the law. Mr. Boston stated the statue calls for a four year term but somehow those term limits had slipped back to one year appointments. Judicial Commissioner Director Len Blevins spoke up to reveal that after the Judicial Commissioners Supervisory Committee was formed in September 2016, the terms of office were changed to one year. It was suggested by Attorney Boston that in order to solidify the authority of the Judicial Commissioner appointees, a one year term could be approved now and then a new resolution could be created in the future to appoint them to four year terms. Commissioner Geisler made a motion to amend resolution 01-2018-5 by making the terms for Judicial Commissioners not to exceed four years. Commissioner Isham seconded his motion.

Before the vote on the amendment, Commissioner Stone also asked the Attorney if he was certain the county was in accordance with the Tennessee Code Annotated requirements for Judicial Commissioners. Attorney Boston responded that the Judicial Commissioners Supervisory Committee had met in February and discussed the roles, responsibilities and training requirements for Commissioners. Mr. Boston indicated that if the four (4) candidates designated in the resolution were approved immediately before their terms expire, Cumberland County would be in concurrence with the law. Both Commissioners Hassler and Isham noted the importance of a Judicial Commissioner position and felt that the required twelve (12) hours of annual training was insufficient for the level of authority and power they hold.

The motion to amend resolution 01-2018-5 carried with Commissioners Scarbrough, York, Hyder, Stone, Foster, Gibson, Lowe, Carter, Wilson, Farley, Turner, Claflin, Geisler and Patterson voting in favor of the amendment. Commissioners Isham, Hassler and Davis voted against the amendment that would change the term limits in resolution 01-2018-5.

3. RESOLUTION 01-2018-5-TO APPOINT JENNIFER PHILLIPS, RON ERICK, GREG WATSON AND JOHN KIRBY AS JUDICIAL COMMISSIONERS FOR CUMBERLAND COUNTY FOR TERMS NOT TO EXCEED FOUR (4) YEARS COMMENCING MARCH 20, 2018:

On motion of Commissioner Hassler, second by Commissioner Gibson, moved to adopt resolution 01-2018-5.

The motion to adopt resolution 01-2018-5 as amended, appointing Jennifer Phillips, Ron Erick, Greg Watson and John Kirby as Judicial Commissioners for Cumberland County for four year terms, carried by a roll call vote of 17 ayes from the Commission present.

4. SUSPEND COMMISSION RULES TO CONSIDER ADDITION OF A RESOLUTION:

Commissioner Patterson moved to waive Commission rules to amend the March 2018 Agenda in order to consider a resolution in regard to additional School Resource Officers. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Claflin.

The motion to suspend Commission rules to add resolution 03-2018-5 to the March 2018 Agenda carried by a roll call vote of 14 ayes from Commissioners York, Hyder, Stone, Foster, Gibson, Davis, Lowe, Carter, Wilson, Farley, Turner, Claflin, Geisler and Patterson. Commissioners Scarbrough, Isham and Hassler voted against the motion to suspend Commission rules.

5. RESOLUTION 03-2018-1-TO APPOINT WILLIE FREEMAN, BILL HARGIS, DANIEL HUSK, JAMES INMAN AND SHERRIE WALKER TO THE CUMBERLAND COUNTY BOARD OF EQUALIZATION FOR TWO (2) YEAR TERMS TO EXPIRE APRIL 30, 2020:

On motion of Commissioner Gibson, second by Commissioner Turner, moved to adopt resolution 03-2018-1.

The motion to adopt resolution 03-2018-1, appointing Willie Freeman, Bill Hargis, Daniel Husk and James Inman to the Board of Equalization for terms to expire April 30, 2020, carried by a roll call vote of 17 ayes from the Commission present.

6. RESOLUTION 03-2018-2-TO ACCEPT OFFER OF SAM BOYD TO PURCHASE PROPERTY OWNED BY CUMBERLAND COUNTY:

On motion of Commissioner Hyder, second by Commissioner Hassler, moved to adopt resolution 03-2018-2.

The motion to adopt resolution 03-2018-2, accepting the offer of Sam Boyd to pay two hundred dollars (\$200.00) to purchase one (1) parcel of county owned property located at 106 Essex Lane in Fairfield Glade, carried by a roll call vote of 17 ayes from the Commission present.

7. RESOLUTION 03-2018-3-BUDGET AMENDMENT, GENERAL FUND, LIBRARY, \$2,410.00:

On motion of Commissioner Carter, second by Commissioner Hassler, moved to adopt resolution 03-2018-3.

The motion to adopt resolution 03-2018-3, a budget amendment for donations received from private citizens and civic organizations for the use and benefit of the Art Circle Public Library, carried by a roll call vote of 17 ayes from the Commission present.

8. RESOLUTION 03-2018-4-BUDGET AMENDMENT, GENERAL FUND, OTHER PUBLIC HEALTH AND WELFARE-ANIMAL SHELTER, \$5,833.00:

On motion of Commissioner Gibson, second by Commissioner Claflin, moved to adopt resolution 03-2018-4.

The motion to adopt resolution 03-2018-4, a budget amendment to designate donated monies from private citizens and various organizations to fund part of the cost associated with the operation of the Cumberland County Animal Shelter, carried by a roll call vote of 17 ayes from the Commission present.

9. RESOLUTION 03-2018-5-TO AUTHORIZE ADDITIONAL SCHOOL RESOURCE OFFICERS IN ORDER TO MAKE AVAILABLE A SCHOOL RESOURCE OFFICER FOR EACH CUMBERLAND COUNTY SCHOOL:

Sheriff Casey Cox and Sheriff Department Captain Jerry Jackson made the Board aware that School Resource Officers (SRO) must have experience as a post certified police officer and must attend a specialized training academy. After Commissioner Hyder asked how soon new SRO's could be put in the four schools, both officers concurred that if eligible candidates are found and they met all the qualifications and training requirements, they could be on the job in the schools as soon as possible. Commissioner Patterson, who sponsored the resolution, moved for its adoption and stressed the importance of a SRO in each Cumberland County School avowing that the process should begin today in order to protect our school children and provide a safer environment for our school system. Mr. Patterson went on to state that Tennessee Code Annotated §49-642 requires a SRO to have at least two (2) years' experience as a police officer. Therefore, the Sheriff should identify who could qualify as a SRO, provide them with more training if necessary, be authorized to hire new officers if needed and purchase any essential equipment. He also noted that after study, three hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$350,000.00) would be needed to start the program and he suggested those funds come from the Unreserved General Fund. Commissioner Claflin seconded motion to adopt resolution 03-2018-5. Budget Committee Members, Commissioners Foster, Scarbrough, Stone and Isham all agreed with the resolution as written but reasoned the Budget Committee should work together at their next meeting along with the Sheriff Department, the School System and the Finance Director to research where the funds should be pulled from, then present their recommendation to the full Commission at their April meeting. The County Attorney was concerned that an expedited resolution with the potential to allocate such a significant amount of funds, without prior public notice to taxpayers, should be reviewed and discussed with the Budget Committee. Commissioner Patterson agreed to strike the last paragraph of the resolution that designated funds for the SRO Program but emphasized the Board should proceed to give authority for the Sheriff to begin the necessary work to start the program without delay.

The motion to adopt resolution 03-2018-5, resolving that 1) the Sheriff shall immediately identify which four officers currently employed in his department will be converted into SRO's and if additional SRO training is required of the officers designated to become SRO's, such training is to begin without delay, 2) the Sheriff shall be authorized to hire four replacement patrol officers, and 3) the Sheriff shall be authorized to purchase, subject to usual bidding processes, the academy training, radios, firearms, vehicles and other such items as necessary to properly equip four new patrol officers, carried with 15 aye votes from York, Hyder Hassler, Stone, Foster, Gibson, Davis, Lowe, Carter, Wilson, Farley, Turner, Claflin, Geisler and Patterson. Commissioners Scarbrough and Isham voted against the adoption of resolution 03-2018-5.

COUNTY OFFICIAL REPORTS: FINANCE DIRECTOR:

The monthly financial report was given by Deputy Finance Director Jennifer Turner who detailed the February 2018 revenues the county received from property taxes, hotel/motel taxes, prisoner boarding and Emergency Medical Service fees. Mrs. Turner also provided the Board with information about the adjusted amounts of local option sales taxes collected last month for the Board of Education.

STATUTORY COMMITTEE REPORT:

When Commissioner Hyder inquired about the current status of the railroad property purchase, Attorney Boston explained that Norfolk Southern Railroad had once again rejected Cumberland County's offer to purchase the portion of property currently owned by the railroad at the Art Circle Public Library site. The Railroad Company instead reverted back to their original offer to allow the county to pay eighteen hundred dollars (\$1,800.00) annually to lease the property. Mr. Boston said there were still plans in place to attempt the acquisition of the property from Norfolk Southern Railroad.

10. ELECTION OF NOTARIES:

On motion of Commissioner Claflin, second by Commissioner Gibson, moved that Charly Abston, Felicia Applegate, Teresa A. Breeding, Misty Brown, Rachel Carr, Mamie Lou Cox, Selena D. Fisher, Robert Grimsley, Jennifer Eaton Irvin, Terry McAnally, Melissa J. Overfelt, William P. Roper, Victoria Ray and Anthony Tuttle are elected as Notary Publics for the State of Tennessee.

The motion to approve the notaries carried by a roll call vote of 17 ayes from the Commission present.

ANNOUNCEMENT:

Commissioner Stone provided information about a program established by the Archives and Heritage Center titled "First Families of Cumberland". She stated the goal of the program was to procure valuable historical documents about the early pioneers of the county which the Archives Center would make available to the public for future genealogical research.

The Cumberland County High School and Stone Memorial High School Girls and Boys Basketballs Teams were recognized by Commissioner Wilson and congratulated by the Board for their wins in district tournaments. Commissioners also commended the Cumberland County High School Cheerleaders for finishing sixth (6<sup>th</sup>) place in the United Cheer Association's National High School Cheer Championships.

11. ADJOURNMENT:

On motion of Commissioner Carter, second by Commissioner Hyder, moved the March 19, 2018 Monthly Commission Meeting be adjourned at 6:58 o'clock P.M.

The motion to adjourn the meeting carried by voice vote from the Commission present.



**AGREEMENT BETWEEN  
CUMBERLAND COUNTY, TENNESSEE  
AND  
ORGANIZATIONAL MANAGEMENT GROUP**

THIS AGREEMENT, made this 17th day of April 2018 by and between Cumberland County, Tennessee hereinafter referred to as the "Client" and the Organizational Management Group, hereinafter referred to as the "Consultant", serves to establish a contractual agreement for professional services as indicated below.

**WITNESSETH**

Whereas, the consultant is able and learned in Classification & Compensation and human resource related disciplines and is well qualified to advise and assist the Client; and

Whereas, the consultant is ready, willing and able to act as consultant to the Client in these matters;

Now, therefore, in consideration of the mutual agreements hereinafter contained and subject to the terms and conditions herein stated, it is understood and agreed by the parties as follows:

- 1. WORK TO BE PROVIDED BY THE CONSULTANT:** The Consultant agrees to perform a variety of human resource related activities including but not limited to the update and maintenance of the Client's Classification & Compensation Plan.
- 2. WORK TO BE PROVIDED BY THE CLIENT:** The Client, with the guidance of the Consultant, will be primarily responsible for the identification of needs, the distribution of documents, data collection and ensuring the availability of staff as necessary to carry out the tasks identified in the agreement referenced above.
- 3. COMPENSATION AND PAYMENT:** The Client will pay to the consultant, and the consultant agrees to accept as full compensation and payment an amount not to exceed \$3,750 for the completion of the above referenced tasks which will be billed to the Client on a monthly basis at the rate of \$100.00/hr. in accordance with the terms and conditions specified below.
- 4. TERMS:** The term of this agreement shall commence on April 17, 2018 and expire on December 31, 2018. Upon the sole discretion of the Client, this agreement may be extended for one additional one-year period. Either party may cancel this agreement upon thirty (30) days written notice thereof to the other party. In case of cancellation, termination or expiration of this agreement for any reason, the Consultant will submit or return all papers, records, memoranda and working materials relating to the work under this agreement. At termination, cancellation or expiration of this agreement in any manner, any payment to the Consultant herein to the date of termination, cancellation or

expiration shall be in full satisfaction of all claims against the Client under this agreement.

**5. LOCAL LAWS:** Notwithstanding any other provisions, conditions, or terms herein, each term, condition and provision herein is subject to the provisions of the rules and regulations of the Government of Cumberland County, Tennessee and the constitution and laws of the State of Tennessee.

**WHEREAS**, T.C.A 49-6-42 requires a School Resource Officer (SRO) to have a minimum of two years experience as a police officer.


**WHEREAS**, the Cumberland County Board of Commissioners recognizes it would be in the best interests of the residents of Cumberland County to provide the four additional School Resource Officers (SROs) without delay.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by Cumberland County Board of Commissioners to authorize the Cumberland County Sheriff's Department to immediately undertake the following measures:

- 1) The Sheriff shall immediately identify which four officers currently employed in his department will be converted into School Resource Officers. If additional SRO training is required of the officers designated to become SRO's, such training is to begin without delay.
- 2) The Sheriff shall be authorized to hire four replacement patrol officers.
- 3) The Sheriff shall be authorized to purchase, subject to usual bidding processes, the academy training, radios, firearms, vehicles and other such items as necessary to properly equip four new patrol officers.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** by Cumberland County Board of Commissioners to make available to the Cumberland County Sheriff's Department monies not to exceed \$350,000 from the Cumberland County Unreserved General Fund Balance to pay for these outlined unforeseen emergent financial needs.
