Attached is a copy of the agenda as of this date. I am looking forward to seeing you there.

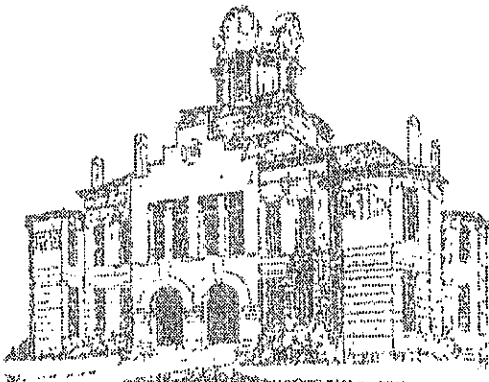

Sheriff Casey Cox called the meeting to order at 6:00 o'clock P.M. Present and presiding was Mayor Allen Foster who invited Willard Dale of Cumberland View Baptist to deliver the invocation. The Young Marines led the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag of the United States of America. 
WHEREAS, said authority is to provide for the expansions of industrial and other economic development of Cumberland, Morgan, and Roane Counties; and

WHEREAS, Cumberland County, Tennessee, has a notable heritage as home to many honorable and affectionately remembered citizens who have been willing to serve in the military; and

WHEREAS, a Gold Star Family is the immediate family member(s) of a fallen service member who died while serving in a time of conflict; and

WHEREAS, it is appropriate that we honor the families of those brave sons and daughters who have made the ultimate sacrifice to preserve the freedoms we enjoy today; and

WHEREAS, it is appropriate that we should honor, preserve, and educate to ensure that current and future generations never forget the service and sacrifice of those Vietnam Veterans that fought to preserve the freedoms we enjoy today; and

WHEREAS, the Building and Grounds Committee met on November 22, 2022 and were presented with ideas for memorials at the War Memorial Park for Gold Star Families and Vietnam Veterans; and

WHEREAS, the Building and Grounds Committee voted to have the County Mayor move forward with planning and construction of both Gold Star and Vietnam Veterans Memorials on the site of the War Memorial Park, with funding coming from private groups.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the Cumberland County Board of Commissioners that:

Cumberland County Parks & Grounds Dept.

There are two possible locations for the installation of a Gold Star Monument in the Veterans Memorial Park. Both locations show the Monument installed parallel to 4th St. approximately 15ft in from the 4th St. sidewalk. The primary location would be between the Lamp Post and the Park Bench toward the west end of the park. The secondary location would be approximately 15 ft. in from the 4th St. sidewalk and 40 ft.+/- west of the Main St. sidewalk (between the first 2 trees on the north side of the park). See attached map. The 811 service shows no utilities being in issue for either location at the present time. See attached report.

This project is being provided by private funding and being installed by Artistic Monuments of Crossville. They will excavate for a foundation. Pour a concrete footer and set the Monument in place according to code and best practices for installation. See attached for a rendering of the monument. The monument will be 8ft. 6" wide, approx. 6ft. tall and 2ft. deep seating on a foundation of approx. 10 ft. X4ft. X2ft. deep. When construction is completed, they will restore the landscape around the monument to as close to original as can be done.

WHEREAS, Resolution 07-2011-3 established the Cumberland County Archives and Family Heritage Center at 95 East First Street; and

WHEREAS, Resolution 08-2018-2 established records maintenance fees in accordance with State law; and

WHEREAS, Resolution 01-2021-07 approved a construction and renovation project for the County Archives facility; and

WHEREAS, Resolution 01-2021-08 approved the issuing of capital outlay notes not to exceed \$1,600,300.00 in aggregate principal, to provide funds for the future of the County Archives project; and

WHEREAS, Resolution 08-2021-6 redirected funds borrowed in Resolution 01-2021-08 and approved the purchase of the old Progressive Savings Bank located at 1760 S Main St Crossville, TN – Cumberland County Map 113 Parcel 022.01 for \$1.125 million dollars with revenue from archives fees being used to pay for the purchase and renovation for the County Archives facility; and

WHEREAS, even though the funding was previously approved, to date, no funds obtained through the records maintenance fee authorized in Resolution 08-2018-2 have been spent to purchase the property located at 1760 S Main Street; and

WHEREAS, Resolution 11-2022-2 temporarily halted construction at 1760 S Main Street until January 31, 2023, while a permanent solution was found and funded for the locations of both the County Clerk's office and the Cumberland County Archives; and

WHEREAS, the Building and Grounds Committee convened on December 13, 2022 with much discussion concerning the location and renovations for the County Clerk's office and the County Archives facility, as well as discussion on renovations needed at the 1905 Cumberland County Courthouse; and

WHEREAS, during the Building and Grounds Committee on December 13, 2022, a motion was approved to:

- A. Reallocate the original \$1,600,300 plus architect fees to fund a modified renovation of the current County Archives facility.
- B. Keep the County Clerk's office at 1760 S Main Street with \$10,000 to be allocated for restoring the building.
- C. Reimburse funds allocated via capital outlay note in Resolution 01-2021-08 used to purchase 1760 S Main Street plus any other expenses that have been used from the original \$1,600,300 allocated for the County Archives project.
- D. Stop all construction work at 1760 S Main Street until County Archives plans and funding is approved.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Cumberland County Commission that:

- A. The original amount of \$1,600,300 via Resolution 01-2021-08, plus the additional amount required to cover architect fees not to exceed \$65,000, is to be allocated to tear down the

rear portion of the current County Archives facility, and rebuild using a smaller footprint of two floors of approximately 2,000 square feet each, with work being completed by a professional contractor.

- B. The County Clerk's office will remain at 1760 S Main Street, with \$10,000 to be allocated from funds as determined by the Budget Committee, to reinstall the drive through window, a canopy, and other work needed to restore the building, with the work to be completed by TCAT.
- C. Reimburse the \$1.125 million allocated via capital outlay note in Resolution 01-2021-08 used for purchasing 1760 S Main Street, plus any other expenses taken from the original \$1,600,300 allocated to the archives project, using funds from Debt Service Fund Balance or General Fund Fund Balance, as determined by the Debt Management Committee.
- D. No construction or renovation work will proceed at 1760 S Main Street until plans for the County Archives project are approved and funded by the full Cumberland County Commission.

Be it further resolved, this resolution shall take effect immediately, the public welfare requiring it.

JOINT ECONOMIC COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT BOARD
IN CUMBERLAND COUNTY, TENNESSEE**

This interlocal agreement is made and entered into by and between the participating governments, which are as follows: Cumberland County, Crossville, Crab Orchard, Pleasant Hill.

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, in enacting Acts of 1998, Public Chapter 1101, commonly referred to as "growth policies legislation," the Tennessee General Assembly intended that local government engage in long-term planning, and that such planning be accomplished through regular communication and cooperation among local governments, the agencies attached to them, and the agencies that serve them; and,

WHEREAS, the legislature also intended that the growth plans required by Public Chapter 1101 result from the communication and cooperation among local government; and,

WHEREAS, Public Chapter 1101 requires the creation in each county of a joint economic and community development board established by interlocal agreement pursuant to Tennessee Code Annotated §5-1-113 to foster communication relative to economic and community development between and among government entities, industry, and private citizens; and,

WHEREAS, parties to this Agreement have agreed that it is advantageous to the local governments and the citizens of Cumberland County, as a whole, that an agreement be reached to facilitate growth and development in a cooperative effort; and,

WHEREAS, pursuant to Tennessee Code Annotated §5-1-113 and §12-9-101 et. seq., Interlocal Agreements between local governments are authorized.

NOW, THEREFORE, parties agree as follows:

1. **BOARD.** There is hereby created a joint economic development board The Cumberland County Joint Economic Community Development Board, hereinafter referred to as the "Board."
2. **BOARD PURPOSE.** The purpose of the Board is to foster communication and facilitate economic and community development between and among governmental entities, industry, and private citizens.

3. **BOARD AUTHORITY.** The Board is authorized to make periodic progress and status reports to the parties to this Agreement.
4. **MEMBERSHIP OF THE BOARD.** The Board shall consist of the County Mayor, the Mayor of each municipality in the County, one (1) City of Crossville City Councilmember, the City of Crossville City Manager, three (3) Cumberland County Commissioners, three (3) representatives selected by the Chamber of Commerce, one (1) representative from the largest utility in the county, one (1) representative of agriculture, one (1) representative from the private sector selected by the other non-executive committee members of the Joint Economic Development Board, and members at large as determined by State requirements and/or the needs determined by the JECDB.
5. **TERMS OF OFFICE.** The terms of office for elected officials shall coincide with the terms of office for their elected positions. Terms for non-elected Board members and those not covered by County, City, and Chamber appointments, such as at-large members, will be elected in the second year following the local election cycle or as needed to accommodate state requirements. Terms will be for four (4) years except Chamber appointments, which will be for three (3) years. The Director of Schools membership to the Board will also coincide with his/her role as Director of Schools.
6. **OFFICERS.** Following the appointment of all Board members, a chair, vice-chair, and secretary-treasurer shall be elected by membership. Elected officers will serve two (2) year terms, and officer elections will be held during the fourth quarterly meeting, following local elections to coincide with any county committee appointment changes. The officers shall serve as members of the executive committee. The chair shall call regular and special-called meetings of the Board and executive committee, preside at all meetings of the Board and executive committee, and shall generally be authorized to exercise general supervision of activities and functions approved by the Board and/or executive committee. The vice-chair shall perform the duties of chair in his/her absence. In the absence of both the chair and vice-chair, the County Mayor will convene the meeting. The secretary-treasurer shall keep or cause to be kept the minutes of all Board and executive committee meetings and maintain such records and shall be the chief financial officer of the Board. The secretary/treasurer shall supervise grants and exercise general supervision of financial activities of the Board. Unless a replacement budget is adopted before April 1 in compliance with TCA 6-58-114(h), the JECDB adopts a yearly zero (0) dollar budget. That budget will change in accordance with the actual grant funding awarded or other revenue identified and approved by the JECDB. If the JECDB determines that a project requiring local funds would benefit the County economically, the funding mechanism outlined by the State in TCA 6-58-114(g) would be used. Each funding body must approve their share as determined in TCA 6-58-114(g) before the project can move forward.
7. **EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE.** The Executive Committee shall consist of the chair, vice-chair, secretary/treasurer, County Mayor, and Mayor(s)-of the larger municipality(ies) in the County and other members as determined by the Board.

The executive committee shall have all of the powers of the Board between meetings, but cannot modify any action taken by the Board.

8. MEETINGS. The Board shall meet a minimum of four (4) times each year, and the executive committee shall meet at least four (4) times each year. Minutes of all meetings of the Board and executive committee are subject to the Tennessee open meetings law.
9. FUNDING. It is agreed that the activities of the Cumberland County Joint Economic Development Board shall be funded by grants or by equal funding as outlined by the State in TCA 6-58-114(g). Donation of Funds. A joint economic and community development board is authorized to transfer or donate funds that it has received from participating governments and outside sources to other public or non-profit entities within the county to be used for economic or industrial development purposes in accordance with T.C.A. § 6-58-114. Grants awarded to the JECDB will be received by the Cumberland County Finance Department and distributed to the approved recipient(s) as specified in writing by the JECDB.
10. RULES OF ORDER. All business shall be transacted in accordance with the latest edition of *Roberts Rules of Order*.
11. AMENDMENTS. This agreement may be amended by the adoption of any such amendment(s) by the governing bodies of the parties to this agreement.
12. OTHER AGREEMENTS. Nothing contained in this agreement shall prohibit or restrict any of the parties hereto from entering into other interlocal agreements as provided by law.
13. EFFECTIVE DATE. This agreement shall become effective upon its approval by the Board of Commissioners of Cumberland County, Tennessee, and the governing bodies of each of the participating municipalities. This agreement shall be in full force and effect between the parties upon its execution by the respective authorized officials of each of the governmental entities.
14. REPRESENTATIVE OF AUTHORIZATION. The participating governments evidence their approval by the signatures below of the authorized representatives of such participating governments. By such signatures, each officer executing the agreement represents and each participating government represents to the other participating governments that this agreement has been duly and lawfully approved by the participating government they represent.



RESOLUTION# 01-2023-10

A RESOLUTION TO AMEND THE ORIGINAL RESOLUTION MAKING APPROPRIATIONS FOR THE VARIOUS FUNDS, DEPARTMENTS, INSTITUTIONS, OFFICES AND AGENCIES OF CUMBERLAND COUNTY TENNESSEE, FOR THE YEAR BEGINNING JULY 1, 2022 AND ENDING JUNE 30, 2023.

SECTION 1. BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of County Commissioners of Cumberland County, Tennessee assembled in regular session on the 17th day of January, 2023 hereby amends the language related to the approval of the School Federal Projects Fund (as shown in bold italics below) to the original appropriating resolution approved by the Board of Commissioners of Cumberland County, Tennessee, assembled in special session on the 2nd day of August, 2022, that the amounts hereafter set out are hereby appropriated for the purpose of meeting the expenses of the various funds, departments, institutions, offices and agencies of Cumberland County, Tennessee, for the capital outlay, and for meeting the payment of principal and interest on the County's debt maturing during the year beginning July 1, 2022 and ending June 30, 2023, according to the following schedule:

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the budget for the School Federal Projects Fund shall be the budget and all amendments approved for separate projects within the fund by the Tennessee Department of Education and the local board of education.

SECTION 2. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that there are also hereby appropriated certain portions of the commissions and fees for collection taxes and licenses and for administering other funds which the Trustee, County Clerk, Circuit Court Clerk, Clerk and Master, Register, and the Sheriff and their officially authorized deputies and assistants may severally be entitled to receive under State Laws heretofore or hereafter enacted. Expenditures out of commissions, and/or fees collected by the Trustee, County Clerk, Circuit Court Clerk, Clerk and Master, Register, and the Sheriff may be made for such purposes and in such amounts as may be authorized by existing law or by valid order of any Court having power to make such appropriations. Any excess commissions and/or fees collected over and above the expenditures duly and conclusively authorized shall be paid over to the Trustee and converted into the General Fund as provided by law.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that if any fee officials, as enumerated in Section 8-22-101 TCA, operate under provisions of Section 8-22-104, TCA, provisions of the preceding paragraph shall not apply to those particular officials.

SECTION 3. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that any amendments to the budget, except for amendments to the budget for funds under supervision of the Director of Schools, shall be approved as provided in Section 5-9-407. The Director of Schools must receive approval of the Board of Education for transfers within each major category of the budget, and approval of both the Board of Education and Board of County Commissioners for transfers between major categories as required by law.

One copy of each amendment shall be filed with the County Clerk, one copy with the Chairman of the Budget Committee, and one copy with each divisional or departmental head concerned. The reason(s) for each transfer shall be clearly stated; however, this section shall in no case whatsoever be construed as authorizing transfer from one fund to another, but shall apply solely to transfers within a certain fund.

Provided further that only the Cumberland County Legislative Body as a whole shall give approval for transfer to or from any line item involving salaries and between Functions, as required by law.

SECTION 4. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that any appropriations made by this resolution which cover the same purpose for which a specific appropriation is made by statute is made in lieu of but not in addition to said statutory appropriation. The salary, wages, or remuneration of each officer, employee, or agent of the County shall not be in excess of the amounts authorized by existing law or as set forth in the estimate of expenditures which accompanies this resolution. Provided, however, that appropriations for such salaries, wages, or other remuneration hereby authorized shall in no case be construed as permitting expenditures for an office, agency, institution, division or department for the year ending June 30, 2023. The aggregate expenditures for any item of appropriation shall in no instance be more than the amount herein appropriated for such item.

SECTION 5. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that any resolution which may hereafter be presented to the Board of County Commissioners providing for appropriations in addition to those made by this Budget Appropriation Resolution shall specifically provide sufficient revenue or other funds, actually to be provided during the year in which the expenditure is to be made, to meet such additional appropriation. Said appropriating resolution shall be submitted to and approved by the State Director of Local Finance after its adoption as provided by section 9-21-403, TCA.

SECTION 6. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the County Mayor and County Clerk are hereby authorized to borrow money on revenue anticipation notes, provided such notes are first approved by the Director of Local Finance, to pay for the expenses herein authorized until the taxes and other revenue for the year 2022-2023 have been collected. The proceeds of loans for each individual fund shall not exceed 60% of the appropriations of each individual fund and shall be used only to pay the expenses and other requirements of the fund for which the loan is made. The loan shall be paid out of revenue from the fund for which money is borrowed. The notes evidencing the loans authorized under this section shall be issued under the applicable sections of Title 9, Chapter 21, Tennessee Code Annotated. Said notes shall be signed by the County Executive and countersigned by the County Clerk and shall mature and be paid in full without renewal not later than June 30, 2023.

SECTION 7. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the delinquent county property taxes for the year 2021 and prior years and the interest and penalty thereon collected during the year ending June 30, 2023, shall be apportioned to the various county funds according to the subdivision of the tax levy for the year 2021. The Clerk & Master and the Trustee are hereby authorized and directed to make such apportionment accordingly.

SECTION 8. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that all unencumbered balances of appropriations remaining at the end of the year shall lapse, and be of no further effect at the end of the year at June 30, 2023.

SECTION 9. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that any resolution or part of a resolution which has heretofore been passed by the Board of County Commissioners which is in conflict with any provision in this resolution be and the same is hereby repealed.

SECTION 10. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that this resolution shall take effect from and after its passage and its provisions shall be in force from and after July 1, 2022. This resolution shall be spread upon the minutes of the Board of County Commissioners.

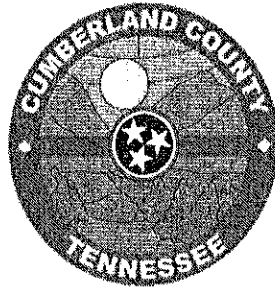

1. **Call to Order** – The meeting was called to order at 4:30 pm by Commissioner Wendell Wilson. A quorum was present. Commissioner Mark Baldwin was absent.
2. **Approval of Minutes** – A Motion was made by Commissioner David Gibson and seconded by Commissioner Colleen Mall to approve the Minutes from the last meeting. The Motion Passed and the Minutes were approved.
3. **Election of Officers**
 - a. **Election of Chairman**- A Motion was made by Commissioner Darrell Threet to elect Commissioner Wendell Wilson as Chairman and seconded by Commissioner Deborah Holbrook. The Motion Passed and all approved.
 - b. **Election of Vice Chairman**- A Motion was made by Commissioner Dewey Walker to elect Commissioner Tom Isham as Vice Chairman and seconded by Commissioner Terry Lowe. The Motion Passed and all approved.
 - c. **Election of Secretary**- A Motion was made by Commissioner Terry Lowe to elect Commissioner Colleen Mall as Secretary and seconded by Commissioner Deborah Holbrook. The Motion Passed and all approved.

4. **Homestead Tower-** Brenda Tollett, with the Tower Association addressed the board in regards to the roof of the tower continues to leak. The Tower Association hired cleaners to clean up dead bats and such and a maintenance person to replace rotten wood. During the Apple Festival, an individual had a drone that was flown over top of the tower and noticed several shingles that were missing from the roof. (someone with the tower association will send images) Over \$10,000 has been spent by the Tower Association for repairs to the tower so far this year.

During the last meeting it was suggested that the association look into a grant to help with repairs to the roof. Brenda stated the association does not have the time nor resources for grant writing. Rebecca Stone suggested contacting Joyce at the library and Beth Davis for assistance. The maintenance supervisor will also stop by the tower and assess the issues. He will also obtain some bids to fix the roof.

The Tower Association stated the structure of the building cannot be changed or it would not be able to stay on the registered historical building list.

The board agreed to bring back to next meeting bids to fix/repair roof and to set up meeting with Brenda, Rebecca, Joyce, and Beth in regards to grant for assistance with repairs.

5. **Old Business-** None

6. **New Business-** Cumberland County Court House

Mayor Allen Foster stated there was a leak at the courthouse. When checked on Friday afternoon, it was discovered two main trusses that support the roof of the front of the building were separated and pulled away from the wall. It is recommended to evacuate the original part of the building immediately due to safety issues. The back part of the building is fine.

Mayor Allen Foster suggested using the new Archive building until the repairs are made to the courthouse. It would need to be cleaned and internet/phone service added. It may take up to three weeks for the archives building to be ready for customers. Jule Bryson, County Clerk stated he would contact surrounding counties for assistance with day to day work, let employees retrieve personal belongings first thing Tuesday morning, and begin closing the front portion, along with both side doors. Per the committee, there is plenty of optional areas for county meetings.

TCAT Crossville President Cliff Wightman stated when repairing the clock at the top of courthouse several years ago they reported a leak and repairs were made at that time.

Kim Chamberlin with Upland Designs suggests the following:

Upland Design Group (UDG) in association with Logan Patri Engineering (LPE) will submit a proposal to provide structural engineering services to design emergency shoring work for the two deteriorated roof trusses over the main courtroom of the Cumberland County Courthouse. This emergency shoring work is necessitated to stabilize the two trusses and safely allow further investigation into the amount of damage in the truss bearing points and to provide a design solution to correct the deficient material.

UDG will provide an additional proposal for the investigation work along with the emergency shoring work proposal. Once the investigation is complete UDG will then provide a separate proposal to correct the deficient materials.

Rebecca Stone stated the county needs to follow proper procedure steps.
Sue York stated we need to inform the public immediately.

Commissioner Colleen Mall made a Motion to accept Kim Chamberlin's proposal:



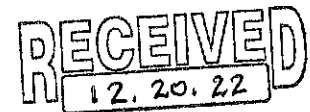

- **Call to Order** – The meeting was called to order at 4:30 pm by Commissioner Wendell Wilson. A quorum was present. All members of the Building and Grounds Committee were present.
- **Approval of Minutes** – There was a little error that needed to be corrected Minutes read start at 4:30 p.m. and ended 5:46 p.m. A Motion was made by Commissioner Deborah Holbrook and seconded by Commissioner David Gibson to approve the Minutes from the last meeting. The Motion Passed and the Minutes were approved.
- **Homestead Tower**– Chris Josey standing in for Brenda King, with the Tower Association addressed the board regarding the roof and bat issues of the tower. Brenda King from the Tower Association sent Wendall images taken by a drone of the roof of the Homestead tower. John Doddre did go look and verifies it is asbestos. His recommendation is to start with fascia boards and bat netting.

The Tower Association has been in touch with Mark Dudley who works very closely with the Historical Commission, and he believes the Tower would be an ideal candidate. These are Federal Grants administered through the Tennessee Historical Commission. The biggest grant they have is \$25,000 and are 60/40 grants so they would pay 60% and whomever would be responsible for the other 40%.

They suggest the Tower Association determines what is the most critical problem right now. They would like to see the smaller grants completed. The next cycle coming up deadline is January 31, 2023

The Tower Association stated the structure of the building cannot be changed or it would not be able to stay on the registered historical building list. They will work on finding out the guidelines of what can and can not be done by the next meeting,

The board agreed to bring back to next meeting an assessment from Mark Audley to fix/repair roof, window replacement, bat netting and fascia board repairs. In the meantime, the Tower Association will be working on getting the information for the Federal Grants compiled to be sent in by January 31.

- **Old Business--Cumberland County Seal** – Mayor Allen Foster gave an update that they have somebody working on it. We ask the former mayor that was here when it was created what it was supposed to be. It's considerably different than what we have. We should have some drawings on that service. For one the brown is supposed to be red like the Tennessee flag red. It's supposed to kind of be like the TriStar Tennessee Tristar in the middle and the band is supposed to be the red from the flag, which is kind of a cool concept. Since they have figured out what it's supposed to be, they are working from there
- A Consensus was taken by Commissioner Wendell Wilson that **meeting time be changed from 4:30pm to 4pm so the Environmental Management Meeting can follow the Building and Grounds Committee.** By a unanimous show of hands of members, the Consensus was approved, and they next meeting was set for **November 22 at 4pm.**
- **Cumberland County Court House** – Commissioner Wendell Wilson had spoken recently to Kim Chamberlin who was not present at the meeting. Kim had stated that the engineer firm that is going to date the recommendations is going to be here that week and they would give us a full recommendation in the near term. Just as soon as they had their evaluation complete, and Kim will keep us updated.

John Doddre gave an update that Saturday they were going to bring a vacuum truck up there and vacuum all the way across the courtroom the insulation out because the next step would be to cut the ceiling and about 12 feet up from the window wall back into the court. While they are doing that, they are going to be trying to figure out how they're going to do the temporary shoring. They will put some type of beam or structure across the whole courtroom floor there and temporarily and correctly shim those trusses up to hold that roof up correctly. When they ripped the carpet up, they found good news that it was concrete instead of wood which will help with the shoring.

- **New Business** – Commissioner Dewey Walker the motion for the County Clerk's office to
Move permanently to the Progressive Bank Building. Motion was seconded by Commissioner Isham. Rationale for motion is convenience and accessibility for patrons of the Clerk's office.

Discussion

Commissioner Wendell Wilson suggested the Committee take time to objectively review all pros/cons Regarding a permanent location for the County Clerk and the clerk's office will be temporarily housed at the bank for some time.

Commissioner Colleen Mall stated that deliberation for the renovation of the Archives has been ongoing over a number of years and was finally approved and budgeted for the Archives to

permanently re-locate to the Progressive Bank building. An alternative, economically feasible solution for the Archives would need to be found before deciding that the County Clerk should move to the bank building permanently. Commissioner Wilson added that any motion should include the Archives renovation. N.B.: CTAS agrees the Commission has an affirmative duty to maintain a safe and appropriate location for public records. State law, passed in 2018, requires secure storage of public records.

Nathan Brock stated that in January 2021, the original amount budgeted for the renovation of the church was \$1.63 million. In August 2021 the Commission voted to purchase the Progressive Bank Building for the Archives instead of renovating the old church building where the Archives is currently located. To date, approximately \$1.5 has been spent on the bank purchase and renovation leaving approximately \$415K to complete the project for the archives. Scheduling delays with TCAI prevented the installation of the secure records storage vault which is the last required renovation before move-in.

The project was funded through Debt Service and is to be paid back from fees generated by the Archives. Archive fees may only be spent on maintaining and storage of records. No Archive fee money has been transferred to the project, as typically Debt Service payments are not established until the project is done. The first-year payment would amount to \$75K and thereafter, the Budget Committee would review to determine the amount assessed each year.

Mayor Foster commented that there is an immediate need for secure storage of records and that is why the fee structure was originated. Joyce has been very patient through the years, but Mayor foster's opinion is to move forward with the Archives project at the bank and find another solution for the County Clerk's office.

County Clerk Jules Bryson stated that some taxpayers want his office to remain in the bank building because it is convenient for them, (although no formal survey has been taken). It is set up for tellers and a drive-thru window, there are no steps, and there is good storage. Clerk Bryson says he is the only county official who is operating in three different rooms at the Court House. He stated he is fighting for what he understands taxpayers want and for his employees, some of whom have been employed there for 30 years.

Commissioner Mall stated that those same issues of accessibility hold true for all the public offices in the Court House. She added that having public offices located together (as at the Court House) could be seen as a convenience for taxpayers as well.

Joyce Rorabaugh, archive Director, stated that she wants to stay in the existing building if a vault can be added. She cited the critical need for the Justice Center to have a secure area for records. She also stated that she does not have an issue with parking as the Archives does not have the same volume of drop-in traffic as other departments. She remarked that discussion of this project has been going on for 6-7 years and any changes to the use of the bank building must include solutions to the Archives' legally required storage needs.

Commission Dewey Walker passed out a document regarding County Clerk fee's. As it reads:

*BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF
TENNESSEE:*

SECTION 1. Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 67-4-723, is amended by adding at the end of subdivision (a)(1) the following language:

In the case of the county clerk, three dollars (\$3.00) of the fifteen-dollar fee shall be earmarked for computer hardware purchases or replacement but may be used for other usual and necessary computer related expenses at the discretion of the county clerk. The earmarked amount shall be preserved for these purposes and shall not revert to the general fund at the end of a budget year if unexpended.

Mayor Foster recommended pausing construction for a short period so a solution can be reached. That makes everybody work together instead of forming factions. That is the only way to keep this from deteriorating, which has happened in the past.

Commissioner Wilson called to proceed with a vote for the motion. Commissioner Dewey Walker made the motion for the County Clerk's office to move permanently to the Progressive Bank building. Motion was seconded by Commissioner Isham. By a show of right hands: In favor 3; Opposed 5. Motion failed.

Commissioner Walker make a second motion: To cease construction at the Progressive Bank until a solution is found. Motion seconded by David Gibson. By a show of right hands: In favor: 5 Opposed: 3. Motion passed.

- Commissioner Sue York wrote a letter to the committee, which was read by Commissioner Wendell Wilson, Motion made for Plaque honoring Steve Norris and for it to be placed on the building that was used by Steve Norris by Colleen Mall. Seconded by Dewey Walker. By a show of right hands motion was united and passed.
- **Adjournment** -- A Motion was made by Commissioner Deborah Holbrook and seconded by Commissioner Dewey Walker to adjourn the Meeting. The Motion passed and the Meeting was adjourned at 5:48 PM.

- **Call to Order** – The meeting was called to order at 4:00 pm by Commissioner Wendell Wilson. Seven members were present so there was a quorum to proceed.
- **Approval of Minutes** – Commissioner Colleen Mall felt that Number 7 on the minutes needed to be reworked so, minutes were not approved. Commissioner Wendell Wilson suggested that she make edits as she sees fit and he will give them back to the Secretary to adjust and then the committee can approve the minutes at the next meeting.
- **Homestead Tower**– Brenda King, with the Tower Association addressed the board regarding the Tennessee Historical Commission Grant. They have been doing their part in keeping in contact with Mark Dudley of the Commission about his help with this grant but unfortunately, he has been very sick so there are no new updates.
- **Courthouse Renovation Update** – Mayor Allen Foster gave an update on what has been done by Mr. Chamberlain. He stated that they are going to do the six posts to stabilize and shore it up. When they get the product in to do it with then they will call in the structural engineers in to assess the building as a whole because of a few other issues that have been pointed out downstairs due to weather and things of that nature. Once they give us the whole assessment then that will be brought back to the committee to look at and see what we are going to budget and fund.
- **Vietnam Memorial Discussion** – Sam Coswell, Board of Directors and Tom Oberts, President of Chapter 1015 Vietnam Veterans of America. Tom Oberts provided a picture of what they propose. They propose that we superimpose a different monument next on a big wall across from the Courthouse on Main Street in between the two monuments already there.

Mayor Foster stated that there is a Veteran's Council that John Carter is a part of, and he wanted to do something for the Vietnam Veterans of America, and the Goldstar families as well. Mayor Foster suggests coordinating those activities and working together.

Tom Oberts states that his design would have a bronze medallion for every branch of the military, six inches, plus the POW Mia, what he did when he created the text was to include

everybody in their era, not just the Vietnam veterans. The soldiers who were in Germany, the soldiers who were in were protecting our country. When he wrote this, it was with everybody in mind because they all served our country. It just happened to be that era. We remember the 9 million US who served in Vietnam and across the globe during the period known as Vietnam War, from November 1, 1955, through April 30, 1975. We are forever grateful to you and your families for serving, defending and protecting our great nation. He also notes the 58,300 Plus were killed in hatch and that's why he put the crucifix and we had 317,000 Purple hearts. He tried to make this so when somebody looks at it, they get a little history.

Commissioner Wendell Wilson asks for a motion to coordinate this memorial with the Gold Star Memorial, Commissioner Terry Lowe makes the motion, and Commissioner Darrell Threet makes the second and all agreed. Motion was passed.

- **Old Business – County Buildings and Offices** – Commissioner Wendell Wilson suggests for the Committee to come up with a plan for county building and offices to check what has been and and what needs to be done. Commissioner Deborah Holbrook makes the motion and Commissioner Colleen Mall seconds it, all in agreement. Motion was passed.

 - Proposal number three - the Archives to go back to the bank building as it was purchased with a completed vault that will be finished and then renovate the County Courthouse for the County Clerk's need's.

Commissioner Wendell Wilson states that the chair will entertain a motion for the committee to allow Mayor Foster to get estimates for the Archives on a new building. To get an estimate for a smaller scaled down version of the vault for the Archives, also an estimate of the Archives building to move to the Bank and renovate the County Courthouse for the County Clerks needs. 





This property is currently being mowed by the party that the HSSB hired to keep it mowed for the season. It is hopefully going in the next tax auction for purchase.



Call to Order - Meeting was called to order at 9:02 am by Chairman Wendell Wilson. Quorum was established.

Approval of Minutes - The Minutes from the November 30, 2020 meeting were distributed. Mayor Foster made a motion for approval. Seconded by Wendell Wilson. All approved. Motion carried.

Rail Authority Funding 2022 - Bids were received for the Bridge Rehabilitation Project and all were over the allotted funding amount. On behalf of Nathan Brock, Jennifer Turner of the Cumberland County Finance Department requested that going forward the Finance Department would like to see the contract between the Cumberland County Rail Authority and L'Hoist state that L'Hoist would be responsible for all overages that occurred during projects. Gary Hankins of L'Hoist agreed to this suggestion on overages as L'Hoist budgets every year for overages on all their projects and they would be in agreement of taking care of any overage that is beyond the fixed amount and that Cumberland County and the Rail Authority would not be responsible for these monies. This would not be a blanket contract but a separate contract for each future project.

Mayor Foster would like the Finance Department to send him and County Attorney Philip Burnett a copy of the bids and get Philip to draw up a contract for the current Bridge Rehabilitation Project.

Mayor Foster made a motion to approve the bid for the Bridge Rehabilitation project pending the signing of the contract created by the County Attorney. Wendell Wilson seconded the motion. All approved. Motion carried.


Ozone Crossing – Scott Blaylock - Commissioner Wilson has been contacted by a resident, David Kirk, who is having a problem with the railroad crossing in Ozone. He is a local business man and uses low-boy trailers for his business in that area. He is having issues making it across the tracks with these trailers as the road has deteriorated before and after the tracks causing his trailer to get hung on the tracks. He is afraid he is going to damage the tracks as this action is

causing damage to his trailers. He has asked for this to be looked into and fixed if at all possible before any more damage is done. Road Superintendent Scott Blaylock wants to go out and look at the area after a major rain to see where the roads are holding water and causing the deterioration so they can come up with a plan of action to fix. Blaylock asked how much of the area was in the ROW of the railroad track. Kris of L'Hoist stated that it is 10 foot on each side of the center line of the tracks. Kris also stated that L'Hoist would be amenable to assist in anyway they could to fix the issue including sharing some of the cost. Kris and Scott are going to work together to fix the issue. Scott said it would not be an overnight fix. Wendell is going to contact Mr. Kirk and let him know the issue is being addressed and a plan to fix the issue is in the works.

Old Business - In regards to expanding the Cumberland County Rail Authority from two members to three members that was brought up at the last meeting, Mayor Foster has been in contact with Speaker Sexton at the State of Tennessee to see how we should proceed. The State Legislature modified TCA and Governor Lee has signed the Bill that has changed the law for Rail Authority memberships. The County can choose to have three or five members in their Rail Authority. Wendell made a motion to send a resolution to the full board of county commissioners to recommend there be three members of the Cumberland County Rail Authority. Mayor Foster seconded this motion. All approved. Motion carried.
